OFFICIAL LETTER HEAD OF THE ORGANIZATION

Report of the International Council Supporting Fair Trial and Human Rights on the conduct of the gathering at Al-Irada Square previously, Al-Muslim Al-Barrak currently on June 26, 2021

The International Council Supporting Fair Trial and Human Rights followed up the event, which took place on the evening of July 26, 2021, for the third week in a row, through its representative in the State of Kuwait and the Arab Gulf states, human rights advisor Anwar Al-Rasheed, and the team working with him to monitor and document events at the Al-Irada Square previously, Musalam Albrak currently.

Our team monitored the following:

First: - The event was broadcasted live on the account of the ICSFT through the account of its representative in the State of Kuwait on Twitter for about two hours.

Second: - The gathering turned into a platform for expressing opinions, at the Hyde Park Kuwait, where the following groups participated in words and statements:

- ✚ A group against taking the Covid19 pandemic vaccine.
- ✚ A group upset with the government, whose members brought a toilet that was confiscated by the organizers without justification, although this is a legitimate means of expression.
- ✚ A group representing the stateless people “Bidoon”
- ✚ The “Enough with the Corruption” group which is one of the oldest groups to come to the scene.
- ✚ A group called for the return of refugees and the amendment of laws restricting freedoms.

The activities began simultaneously, peacefully, from eight in the evening and ended at nine (Kuwait time).

We also observed that the Ministry of Interior closed the car parks that are near the square without justification, and the ministry did not respond to the organizers' pleas to open the parking lots. Moreover, we noticed that the demonstrators were protected by the policemen and officers. And this is a good point that we would like to thank the Kuwaiti government for.
